Robot Game

Regional Judging Updates

- Consolidated Rubrics and Judging
 - One 20 min. judging session
 - All three areas will be presented, starting with the 5 min. project presentation. No core values poster but will still have core values activity.
- No robot game tables in the Judging Room.

Consolidated Judging

The 20 minute interview will include the following in this order:

- 5-minute <u>timed</u> Project presentation and the clock starts as soon as the team enters the room.
- 2 minutes questions related to the project. If needed.
- 5-minute Robot Design that includes a 2 minute Robot Design Executive Summary presentation.
- 5-minutes for Core values that includes a 2-minute Core Values Activity (no core values poster will be required this season)
- 3- 5 minutes questions on any category as the judges desire to complete the rubric.






